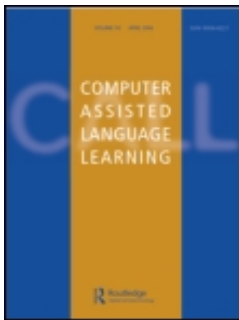
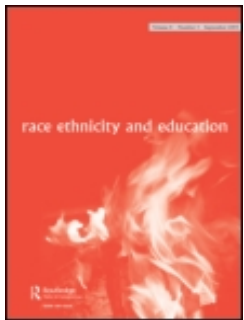




## EDUCATION ARENA BULLETIN, OCTOBER 2009, ISSUE 19

### **New Journal for 2010: *Classroom Discourse***

*Classroom Discourse* will focus on research that considers discourse and interaction in settings where activity is deliberately organised to promote learning. While most papers focus on the discourse of classrooms, others report research in more informal, naturalistic settings in which, while learning is certainly still taking place, it is not occurring in the typical and “traditional”™ space of a classroom. Examples might include online tutorials, peer-peer interactions of work-in-progress, and dialogues between “trainer and trainee”™ in a workplace context.
